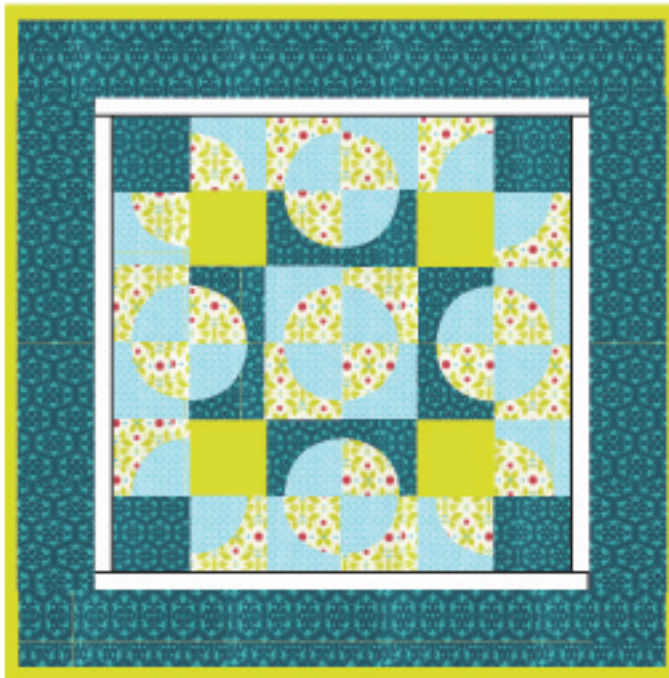


# Baby Drunkard baby quilt

(Finished size: 35" x 35")



The use of the Olfa circle cutter makes this drunkards path quilt easy to cut, without templates and the small size makes it perfect for practicing curved piecing.

## Fabric Requirements:

Fabric A (Modern Whimsy circles): 1/3 yard

Fabric B (Modern Whimsy vines): 1/3 yard

Fabric C (Stitch hexagons): 5/8 yard

Fabric D (Kona solid): 3/8 yard (includes binding)

Fabric E (Kona white); 1/8

Backing: 1 1/4 yards

Batting: "crib size," or 1 1/4 yards of 48" wide batting

Tools:

Olfa circle cutter, rotary cutting mat, clear ruler, rotary cutter, matching thread.

## Cutting list:

Fabric A: cut 10 (4.5" squares), 14 (3.5" squares)

Fabric B: cut 10 (4.5" squares), 14 (3.5" squares)

Fabric C: cut 12 (4.5" squares), 4 (4.5" x WOF strips for border)

Fabric D: cut 4 (4.5" squares), 4 (2" x WOF strips for binding)

Fabric E: cut 4 (1.5" x WOF strips for inner border)

Cut 10 Fabric A, 10 Fabric B, and 8 Fabric C (4.5" squares) into concave pieces. To cut the concave Drunkard's Path pieces, set the Olfa cutter to the 3" mark (check the measurement on the ruler or mat). Place the compass point of the circle cutter on the tip of one corner, (where the star is) and trim off a quarter circle.



Cut 14 Fabric A, 14 Fabric B, and 8 Fabric C (4.5" squares) into convex pieces. To cut the convex Drunkard's Path pieces, set the Olfa cutter to the 3.5" mark (check the measurement on the ruler or mat). Place the compass point of the circle cutter on the tip of one corner, (where the star is) and trim off the extra to leave a quarter circle.

Match the center of a concave piece to the center of a convex piece, right sides together. Pin centers, and then pin the edges together. The convex piece will pucker, so pin it as much as you need to in between to make it lie smoothly. Sew together with a scant 1/4" seam allowance. Press the seam allowance to the concave piece.



Make 10 concave/convex blocks with Fabric A/B, and 10 concave/convex blocks with Fabric B/A. Make 4 concave/convex blocks with Fabric C/A and 4 with Fabric C/B

Sew together the quilt in rows (starting at the top) comprised of 4.5" squares or Drunkard's Path blocks, matching the orientation in the illustration below. Press and sew rows together.

Row 1: C, A/B, B/A, A/B, B/A, C

Row 2: A/B, D, C/B, C/A, D, B/A

Row 3: B/A, C/B, A/B, B/A, C/A, A/B

Row 4: A/B, C/A, B/A, A/B, C/B, B/A

Row 5: B/A, D, C/A, C/B, D, A/B

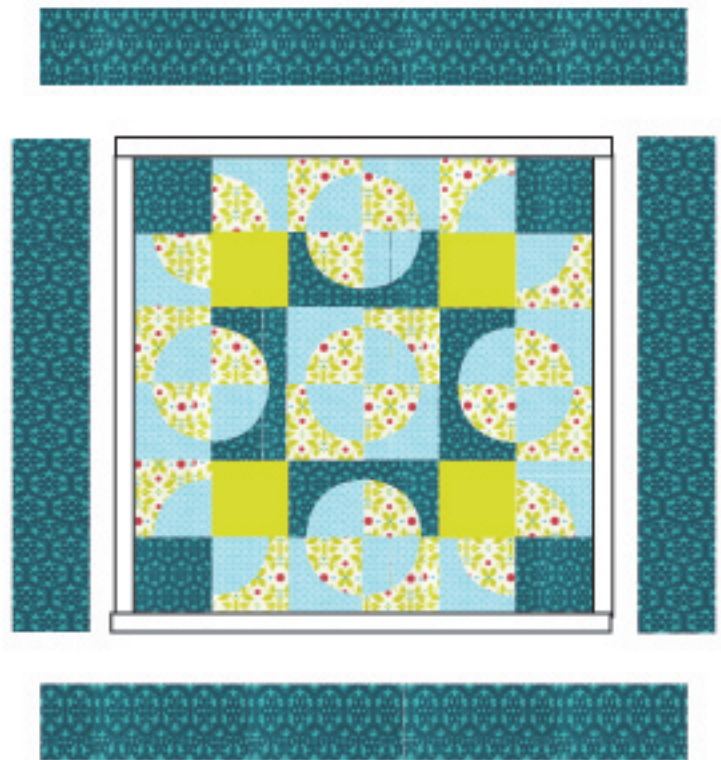
Row 6: C, B/A, A/B, B/A, A/B, C





Sew Inner Border strips to the sides of the quilt center, trim square, then sew Inner Border strips to the top and bottom. Press.

Sew Outer Border strips to the sides of the quilt center, trim square, then sew Outer Border strips to the top and bottom. Press.



Layer quilt backing, batting and quilt top into a quilt sandwich, quilt as desired.  
 Trim square again, and bind.  
 Enjoy your drunk baby!
